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## **Title [200 character limit]:**

**Cleveland's West Side Market at 100: Gustavino Tile and the Power of a Material and an Institution to Elevate the Life and Culture of a City**

## **Seminar Description [100 word limit]:**

A look at the Cleveland's West Side Market, named one of the nation's "10 Great Public Spaces" by the APA, and now celebrating 100 years in continuous operation. This discussion examines the driving forces behind the construction of the Market, as well as the vaulting material, Guastavino tile, used to build its basilica-like main hall. The neighborhood surrounding the Market has experienced strong growth in recent years, despite the recent economic downturn. This discussion explores how historic institutions can play a stabilizing role in neighborhoods and become centerpieces of urban revitalization.

## **Learning Objectives/Outcomes:**

- Understand the history and use of Guastavino tile in constructing some of the great works of early twentieth century architecture.
- Gain insight into some of the motivating philosophies behind the Progressive Movement and the City Beautiful, and their impact on architectural thought and practice in the early 1900's.
- See how historic institutions, such as Cleveland's West Side Market, can be drivers of economic growth and rebirth in our cities.
